


VISION

The school children are exposed to value systems, experience, guidance and mentoring by the elderly.






DOCTORS AT DOORSTEP: COMPREHENSIVE MEDICAL HEALTH CARE VAN (CMHCV)



Realizing the **huge dearth of medical care for the elderly**, we started a Comprehensive Mobile Health Care Van (CMHCV) which brought **Doctors on Doorstep for abandoned elderly people** in the old age homes of Delhi NCR.

The Mobile van visits an old age home once every month.

The doctor sees the residents and provides medicines for an entire month. Some of these are essential for Blood Pressure, Diabetes, Heart, and psychiatric issues.

The physiotherapist also helps the residents with exercises and physiotherapy for better movement.








WHY SENIORS ABODE?

HAI in association with WHO SEARO conducted a **survey** in 200 hundred old age home in 10 metropolitan cities in 2020* and found the following:

- Poor hygiene and cramped living in old age homes.
- No regular trained doctor and physiotherapist in old age home. Around 50% old age home residents are depressed.
- Nearly 40% have dementia.



Established in Jan 2022, Seniors' Abode is an affordable assisted living facility with focus on providing basic medical care.

Located in the premises of Bharat Sevashram Sangha temple, Sriniwaspuri, Delhi, the Seniors' Abodes' principal foundation rests on the idea, "All should live with Dignity and Freedom."



It provides an ecosystem for healthy and active later years of the residents by addressing issues around emotional, physical and financial insecurity.

Seniors' Abode helps to promote pursuits of their passions through meaningful engagement that keeps away the onset of degenerative diseases like dementia and Alzheimer's.


Preetam Kaur, resident, 83 years

THE NEED

India is today one of the fastest growing economies of the world. While being acknowledged as a global leader, this growth comes at a cost to the environment and to society.

With improved health care and high life expectancy, India's population continues to increase so that as the most populous country in the world India's two population segments- the youth and the elderly are increasing significantly.



By 2050 India's elderly population aged 65 + will be touching 14% while 17% population will be of young people aged between 15 and 35 years.

As nuclear families rise, the issue of **abandonment of elderly people** from all sections of the society is on the rise. These older people are there **living alone in their homes**, abandoned to **live in charitable homes** or **even homeless** and living on the road.
